<p><u>Maths Task</u></p> <p><u>Dice Game</u></p> <p>Use the dice we made earlier in the week (or one you already have).</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Roll a dice 4 times and write down each number.2. Make two 2- digit numbers.3. How many different equations can you make with those numbers?4. Solve the equations. <p>Example-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Roll- 4, 6, 2, 12. I made 46 and 123. $46 + 12 = \underline{\quad}$ $46 - 12 = \underline{\quad}$4. $46 + 12 = 58$ $46 - 12 = 34$ <p>Were there any other problems I could have done?</p> <p>Are there a different number of problems for different numbers?</p>	<p><u>English Task</u></p> <p>Interview</p> <p>Today I want you to pretend you are a reporter. You are going to find a member of your family to interview or ask questions to. I want you to ask them 5 different questions all about their favourite game.</p> <p>Before you start. Think about the different question words. Try to start each question with a word.</p> <p>-Who, what, where, when, why...</p> <p>Example-</p> <p>What is your favourite game?</p> <p>How do you play?...</p> <p>Make sure you write down your questions and their answers.</p>
