<p>Interesting Information</p> <p>Write an information page about a subject of your choice. Make sure you read books and/or research on the Internet to find the information you need.</p> <p>Remember to include:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - punctuation - detail to make it interesting. - sub-headings to organise your writing <p><i>Challenge: Can you include diagrams and illustrations with labels and captions to add further detail?</i></p>	<p>Tremendous Times Tables!</p> <p>Choose a times table you are unsure about and need to practise. Make up a game to help you learn this times table. It can be a board game or a card game.</p> <p>Can you bring your game in for us to play during Golden Time?</p>	<p>Super skeletons!</p> <p>Try to draw a picture of the human skeleton! Give it your best go.</p> <p>Try to remember some of the names of the different bones and label your skeleton.</p>
<p>Perfect Printing!</p> <p>Find three different samples of wallpaper or wrapping paper that demonstrate a repeating pattern. If you don't have any at home, you could print pictures from the internet.</p> <p>Write a short paragraph to describe the three samples e.g.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) What is the repeating pattern? 2) What colours are used? 3) Do you like it? Why/why not? 4) What would you do to improve the design? <p><i>Challenge: Create your own repeating pattern. You could either do this by hand or using your computer.</i></p>	<p>Marvellous Maps</p> <p>Imagine you are walking on your route to school. If you don't often walk to school, imagine a route to somewhere else that you walk frequently.</p> <p>Draw a map of your route to school. You could include your house, houses of friends or relatives that you pass on the way, shops and other landmarks, etc.</p>	<p>Performance Poetry!</p> <p>Find a poem that you have enjoyed reading. You could choose a book from the library or go online. Try this website - http://childreypoetryarchive.org/</p> <p>Practise performing the poem at home by heart so that you can perform it to the class.</p> <p><i>Challenge: Can you have a go at writing your own poem to perform? Remember, it doesn't have to rhyme!</i></p>
<p>Fabulous French</p> <p>Design an information poster about France including any interesting facts you can find out.</p> <p>Remember to include pictures e.g. famous places, food etc and a map.</p>	<p>Wonderful Weighing!</p> <p>Choose a cake recipe. Weigh out the ingredients and make your cake. You could take photographs or draw pictures to show what you have weighed.</p> <p><i>Challenge: Can you work out the weight of each set of ingredients you would need to make 2, 4 or 10 cakes?</i></p>
