Can I remind you of the wonderful resource that is our school website (https://www.highworth.bucks.sch.uk/web)? This week we have added photographs and video clips following our trip to 'Young Voices', photographs of our recent 'Perform' workshops and some optional Science Home Learning. Please do have a look and try to make it a site that you and your children visit regularly.

Today, I had my regular catch up with the local Police Community Support Officers. You won't be surprised to hear that on the list of topics covered was parking! They alerted me to the fact that the option to park and walk from the Dolphin pub was not well known. Please can I remind you that this is possible, and, that whilst it takes a little longer to walk from there, it does mean that you avoid the difficulties of parking closer to the school.

I have become very concerned recently about the number of conversations that I have had with children about safeguarding in which 'You Tube' has been mentioned. Many of your children are accessing content that is completely inappropriate for them. Of particular concern is children watching videos of 'You Tubers' playing games with age ratings of 12, 16 and 18. Whilst the children are not actually playing these games, they are being exposed to game content. Please can I urge you to check parental controls on your internet provision and ensure that children only access 'You Tube' whilst in the same room as adults. In this way, you will better be able to monitor and control what is being watched.
