Week 1

Newspaper article



Imagine that a cat called Snuffles has just been crowned king! Write a newspaper article to report upon this shocking event. Remember to use a 'journalist' voice...

Week 2

Instructions



Inspired by Roald Dahl's "George's Marvellous Medicine," write a set of instructions to explain how to create a marvellous medicine of your own! Remember to include imperative verbs – and the more revolting, the better!

Week 3

Description

Imagine that you've met a brand new animal, never before seen. What does the animal look like? What does it eat? How does it behave? Any other interesting facts? If you enjoy art, perhaps you could draw or paint your new animal too?



Week 4

Re-tell a story

Choose a famous story and re-tell it from a different view point. Some ideas could be:

- ✓ The 3 Little Pigs – the wolf
- ✓ Cinderella – the ugly sisters
- ✓ Matilda – Miss Trunchbull

Week 5

Diary Entry
