

Year 2 Home Learning

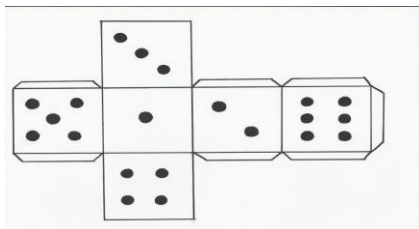
Week Commencing 20 April 2020- Monday
